MQ-Module (to MW57, MW58, or MW59): Projektarbeit Winter 2023/2024

Topic: Recent developments in sustainability reporting

Content:

Over the past decades, a large number of institutions have established and formed the landscape of non-financial reporting standards as well as frameworks. In recent years, a shift in pace as well as a supremacy from voluntary to regulatory non-financial reporting standards has been evident. Driven by the Green Deal, especially the European Union is a trailblazer in this dynamic environment. The implementation of the European Sustainability Reporting Standards (ESRS) poses a number of challenges for European companies. Furthermore, international organizations such as the International Sustainability Standards Board (ISSB) and U.S. regulators are also involved in recent standard development.

During the course of this module ("MW58: Projektarbeit"), we will dive deeper into this exact topic. Participants will first form teams to develop and present a method for determining potential financial effects of sustainability-related risks and opportunities as required by the ESRS. The practice-oriented question is posed in cooperation with the ESG Audit & Assurance Team of Grant Thornton Germany, one of the ten biggest audit companies in Germany. Based on the acquired knowledge, participants will develop and write a research proposal on a selected topic from the research area of regulatory sustainability reporting. Thereby, the module combines both research and practice.

Team presentation:

You will work in teams to develop practice-relevant concepts and ideas in the context of the method development and present them to Grant Thornton Germany. In addition, you will write (also in a team) a short "Executive Summary" of your concepts and ideas. Length of the executive summary: 1,000 – 1,500 words. Submission deadline (including the presentations): November 30, 2023.

Individual written assignment:

You will develop and write a research proposal related to the module's topic. Length: 1,500 – 2,500 words. Submission deadline: February 2, 2024.



For successful completion of the module, both parts (individual written assignment and team presentation) must be passed independently.
